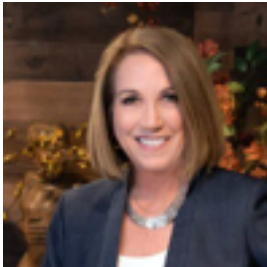

Lee Whittier – Ms. Lee Whittier has been involved in the sport of purebred dogs for over three decades. Her involvement began as an owner, exhibitor and, subsequently, a breeder of Rottweilers. She has owned Akitas, Bullmastiffs, and a Sussex Spaniel. She currently owns, breeds, and exhibits Tibetan Terriers. Ms. Whittier began judging in 2000, and then took a hiatus for several years to work for the American Kennel Club as an Executive Field Representative in the Pacific Northwest. She returned to judging in 2011, and currently judges the Working, Terrier, Toy, and Non-Sporting Groups, seventeen Hound Breeds, ten Sporting Breeds, Bouvier des Flandres, and Best in Show. Ms. Whittier has judged dog shows around the world, from the United States, Canada, South America, and Asia, at shows large and small; all of great importance to each and every exhibitor. Some of the larger shows are Westminster Kennel Club, Kennel Club of Philadelphia, Del Valle Dog Club of Livermore, Great Western Terrier Association, Northern California Terrier Association, Hatboro Dog Club, Inc., Malibu Kennel Club, and the Kennel Club of Palm Springs. Ms. Whittier is a standing member of Dog Fanciers of Oregon, The Central Florida Cairn Terrier Club, Columbia River Cairn Terrier Association, and the Tibetan Terrier Club of America. As an active member in numerous clubs, she has worked in the capacity of Show Chair, President, Vice-President, Secretary, Board Member, and Constitution & By-Laws Revision Committee Member. In addition to judging, Ms. Whittier developed the Dog Show Mentor program, exclusively for owner handlers. This is an online program where owner handlers of all stages and levels learn to develop an individual, strategic approach to showing dogs. She also travels to speak to owner handlers all over the world. She currently lives in Vancouver, Washington, with her husband, Wayne, and their three Tibetan Terriers. Her other interests include gardening and hiking with the dogs.



Meredith Riley I have been involved in the sport of purebred dogs since 2008. As breeder/owner/handler of Pinup Miniature Pinschers, I have owner handled many champions and grand champions in a limited breeding program, including National Specialty winners. My journey in the world of Miniature Pinschers began over a decade ago, driven by my fascination with their distinctive personalities and stunning aesthetics. Over the years, I have honed my expertise in breeding these remarkable dogs, striving for excellence in health, temperament, and conformation. I have also owned and exhibited Miniature Longhair and Miniature Smooth Dachshunds.



Michelle Yeadon PHA/CPHA, is an All-Breed, Professional Dog Handler in British Columbia, Canada. She has been handling dogs professionally since 1989 and won her first Best in Show when she was only 12 years old and is one of Canada's most successful All Breed Handlers. Notice of Agreement

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of communicable disease(s), arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

Communicable Disease refers to any Communicable Disease or mutation thereof. Exhibitors, handlers and patrons are responsible for any cost, loss or expense of any kind, arising directly or indirectly from the actual, potential, alleged or threatened transmission of, contact with, exposure to, existence of, presence of, fear or spread of, a **Communicable Disease** or any mutation thereof, including any costs or expenses incurred to prevent, respond to, test for, monitor, mitigate, remove, cleanup, contain, treat, detoxify, neutralize, assess or otherwise deal with a **Communicable Disease** or any mutation thereof. This applies: (i) regardless of any other contributing or aggravating cause or event that contributes concurrently or in any sequence to the cost, loss or expense; and (ii) to all coverage extensions, additional coverages, exceptions to any exclusion and other coverage grant(s).

Communicable Disease means any disease caused by any substance or agent that occurs through any transmission of the substance or agent from an infected individual or via an animal, vector or the inanimate environment to a susceptible animal or human host where:

(A) the substance or agent includes, but is not limited to, a virus, bacterium, parasite or other organism or any variation thereof, whether deemed living or not, and

(B) the method of transmission, whether direct or indirect, includes but is not limited to, airborne transmission, bodily fluid transmission, transmission from or to any surface or object, solid, liquid or gas or between organisms.

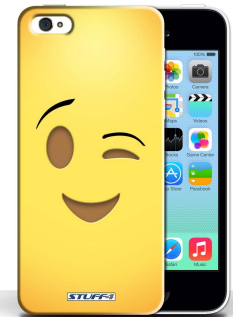
Important Notice:

Exhibitors are expected to exercise their dogs within their grooming space ex-pen, or in the designated exercise area outside the south end of Hall 2.

Furthermore, they are expected to pick up any solid waste from their dog with disposal in a garbage container OUTSIDE Hall 2.

Dog are not to be exercised in any other locations, including but not limited to the parking lot, roadway, against or near the building or garbage cans, or any location within the building other than their grooming space ex-pen.

The club welcomes anyone who witnesses an exhibitor not complying with these rules to please take a picture with their cell-phone of the dog and exhibitor and forward the photo to the club.



REGULAR CLASSES

12.2 Classes

12.2.1 Regular official classes at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in (a) to (k) of this section.

All classes must be divided by sex (except for Specials Only). Only dogs entered in one of the regular, non-regular, or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

(a) **Junior Puppy Class**

Dogs 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show.

(b) **Senior Puppy Class**

Dogs 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show.

(c) **12-18 Month Class (All-Breed Shows)**

Dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

(d) **12-18 Month Class (Specialty Shows)**

Dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show. The Club has the option to split this class as follows: (i) 12-15 Month Class (Specialty Shows only)

Dogs 12 months of age and under 15 months of age on the day of the show.

(ii) 15-18 Month Class (Specialty Shows only)

Dogs 15 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

(e) **Canadian Bred Class**

Dogs born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.

(f) **Bred By Exhibitor Class**

Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/ breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards. Should the owner/breeder be unable to handle the dog in this class, the dog may be moved to the Open Class (at least one hour prior to the judging of the breed in question).

(g) **The Open Class**

All dogs. Dogs may be divided by colour if permission of the CKC is obtained.

(h) **Veterans Class (Specialty Shows Only)**

Dogs seven (7) years of age and over on the day of the show. This class may, at the discretion of the club, be divided by age into not more than three age divided classes. The winners of each class in each sex will compete for Best of Breed. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

(j) **Specials Only**

(i) Dogs which have a recorded CKC registration, Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and have attained the required points for Championship status. All awards earned at the show will be cancelled if it is found that a dog is not registered or has not completed the requirements for a CKC Championship. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible. After awarding Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best of Winners in each breed, the judge may choose a Select Dog and Select Bitch if there are dogs in the ring eligible for these awards. The Select Dog and Bitch must be awarded in the Specials Only class. The dog and bitch selected must be champions and cannot be the Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex Winners.

(ii) A dog entered in Specials Only shall be identified by gender in the judge's book and if incorrectly entered and substantiated by the show secretary or superintendent, shall be excused from the ring by the judge.

12.6 Non-Regular Classes

12.6.1 The non-regular classes allowed at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in this section. If offered, these classes must be included in the premium list. A dog entered in the Brace or Team class that is spayed/neutered must be entered in an Altered Class or in Exhibition Only.

(a) **Baby Puppy Class**

Dogs 3 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are:

Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed

Best Baby Puppy in Group

Best Baby Puppy in Show

{c} **Brace Class**

At an all-breed or specialty show a club may, but is not required to, offer a Brace Class. This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A Brace should be judged as an identical pair – same colour, size, gait, and same stride. When viewed from the side they should appear as one dog and its shadow. A brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead.

(e) **Order of Judging**

When any or all of the above described non-regular classes are offered, and including Altered Classes as described in Section 13, these classes will be judged after Best Puppy in Breed, after Best Puppy in Group and before Best In Show, in the following order: Baby Puppy, Veterans, Altered, Brace, Team, Exhibition Only

(g) **Exhibition Only**

All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competitions. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades if provided for in the premium list.

(h) Classes/Awards Available At Specialty Shows Only

(iii) **Stud Dog and Get**

A Specialty club may, but is not required to, offer a Stud Dog and Get class. This class

shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership in this class need not be identical. The stud dog may be spayed/neutered and must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class.

(iv) **Brood Bitch and Progeny**

This class shall have the same requirements as the Stud Dog and Get class.

(v) **Award of Merit**

This award will be made after the Best of Breed judging. A specialty club may offer one Award of Merit for every 10 dogs competing at Best of Breed level. If this award is to be made, it must be in the premium list and the criteria must be fully explained. Where Awards of Merit are offered, these awards are made by the judge after the awarding of Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Winners, Select Dog and Select Bitch from the dogs remaining in the ring.

13.6 Classes & Awards

13.6.1 These classes shall be for any **spayed** or neutered dogs over 6 months of age. The dogs referred to in paragraphs (a) through (c) will be judged after the judging of the Best Puppy in Breed in the Regular classes, and after Baby Puppy Classes and Veteran Classes if offered.

(a) **Winners Altered Male/Female Class**

(b) **Reserve Winners Altered Male/Female**

The second place male/female shall be given this award.

(c) **Best Altered in Breed**

In each breed, there may be one Best Altered award. This award shall be confined to the Winners altered Male/Female.

15.1 Championship Points

15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows;

*Dogs Competing	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 & more
Points Allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

15.1.3 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Breed at the show, then all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included in the total.

15.1.4 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.

15.1.5 If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.

15.1.6 If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.

15.1.7 The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

Clarification: Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.

15.1.10 Permission shall be granted a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a Specialty for that breed or group.

15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must:

(a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 different judges and,

(b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

(c) have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

15.1.13 The Board interprets the words "earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges" to mean:

(a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level;

(b) each of the three (3) judge's awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing;

(c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing.

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh)

15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation Championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation Championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System

Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

(c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

(d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2 Grand Champion (GCh) Continued.**15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)**

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

8.10 Moving a Dog to Specials

- 8.10.1 A dog that is registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to breed judging. A dog that has a Temporary Competition Number (TCN) is not eligible to be transferred from one (1) of the regular classes to Specials Only
- 8.10.2 If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the championship requirements, all awards will be cancelled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.
- 8.10.3 When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour before breed judging starts of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only. The Show Secretary shall amend the judge's book and the marked catalogue, which is to be sent to the CKC with the requests attached to the appropriate entry forms.
- 8.10.4 No dog may be transferred to another class except as provided in sections 8.2.5 and 8.9.1 and 12.2.1(f)
- 8.10.5 A dog can be moved back into the classes from a special if it has been entered incorrectly only where shows have already closed

8.7 Withdrawal of Entries

- 8.7.1 An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone, but either written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary no later than the official closing date and time as stated in the premium list. If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

8.5 Acceptance of Entries

- 8.5.1 If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.
- 8.5.2 Telephone and telegraph entries are prohibited except as provided by the Board in the event of a postal disruption.
- 8.5.3 No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for purebred dogs.
- 8.5.4 After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in the case of a postal strike.
- 8.5.7 No entries may be changed or altered after the close of entries with the exception as stated in section 8.2.5.
- 8.5.8 In case of a judge change (substitute or overload), an exhibitor may enter a dog under the replacement judge providing that the dog is entered in one of the regular classes of a show being held at the same venue by the same club and has been assigned a competition number. A new entry, along with accompanying fees, will be accepted by the Show Secretary up to one hour prior to the start of the show (see sections 3.3.1, 3.5.1 and 8.5.4).

8.6 Refusal of Entries

- 8.6.1 The authorities of any show may:
- (a) decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
 - (b) refuse to receive, or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness. A club declining an entry or ordering the removal of a dog from its show must report, in writing, all such matters to the CKC with a full explanation and/or reason within 14 days after its show has been held;
 - (c) in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.
- 8.6.2 A club may refuse an entry from an exhibitor known to have tendered a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card unless entries are accompanied by cash, money order or certified cheque.
- 8.6.3 No one shall have any claim or recourse against the club holding the show or any official connected therewith for the refusal of an entry for just cause.

4.7 Indignities to a Judge

- 4.7.1 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

8.3 Entries

8.3.1 Every dog entered in a show must be one of the following:

- a) registered with the CKC;
- b) have an Event Registration Number (ERN);
- c) **have a Temporary Competition Number, and must be** eligible for registration with the CKC;
- d) with the exception of Baby Puppy, if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

8.4 Listed Dogs

- 8.4.1** If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 a) or b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC; it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:
- a) that if born in Canada, **the dog has a Temporary Competition Number, and** it is eligible for individual registration;
 - b) that if not born in Canada, **the dog has a Temporary Competition Number, and** it is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC;
 - c) that if it is a foreign-born and owned dog, **the dog has a Temporary Competition Number.** An Event Registration Number or CKC registration number must be obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

11 Unsportsmanlike Conduct

11.1 It shall be deemed unsportsmanlike conduct if a person during the running of or in connection with an event abuses or harasses a judge, show official or any other person present in any capacity at the event.

11.2 Any handler who displays unsportsmanlike conduct or who is seen to kick, strike or otherwise roughly manhandle a dog at any time during the holding of the event, may be expelled from the show by the Conformation Show Committee.

11.3 The judges shall also have the authority to expel a handler from a show if they observe unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of the handler or see the handler kicking, striking or otherwise roughly manhandling a dog while the event is in progress. It will be the duty of the judge to report promptly to the Conformation Show Committee the expulsion of a handler.

11.4 The Conformation Show Committee shall investigate, at once, any instance of alleged unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of the handler, or any report that a handler has been observed kicking, striking or otherwise roughly manhandling a dog. If the Conformation Show Committee, after investigation, determines that a handler is in violation of this section, and that the incident, if proven, would constitute conduct prejudicial to the sport or the CKC, it shall exercise its authority in accordance with the Complaints section of these rules.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted.

Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor.

Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks.

To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds.

The club reserves the right to remove any person(s) from the show and the show grounds. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of these shows and trials, which are governed by CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB (CKC) rules.

Any person excused by the Show Superintendent or Veterinarian for any reason shall not, compete in any class for any awards for the balance of the shows, trials and or events.

The Show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

Exhibitors may be asked by the show superintendent for proof of third party liability insurance. Failure to produce may result in dismissal from the show grounds.

Dogs must be on the grounds 1 hour prior to the judging of their class.

The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and equipment left at the show grounds.

All recreational units will have buckets underneath for their sink drains. Any one found discharging water on the grounds will be removed by order of the Health Department, and may be subject to fine.

If, because of civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the club, it is impossible to open or complete the show, there is no refund of entry.

Dogs must be on leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building with the exception of the obedience rings.

All dogs must be exercised in the grass areas to the West of the Hall 1 building. Dogs may not relieve themselves on or near the building. Failure to observe this rule may result in dismissal.

Plastic sheeting must be used under all exercise pens and up the sides to prevent a dog from urinating beyond the pen.

Exhibitors are expected to maintain a clean area. Please be considerate when utilizing the building facilities. No dogs are permitted in the washrooms.

The welfare of any children is deemed to be the responsibility of the guardian or parent. Please exercise control and restraint over your child's behaviour.

The club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or vendors/concessions. Check for lost property at the club table. The club reserves the right to refuse an individuals entries, for just cause.

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors space.

Fire lanes in all areas will be maintained.

All exhibitors must follow direction by Chilliwack Heritage Park personnel.

The precincts of these trials will be all other areas reserved for the sole use of the club.

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors grooming space.

Dogs and Equipment may be left in the building at the owners/agents/own risk. Please read "Notice of Agreement."

Any videographer or photographer, other than the official videographer/photographer, that is going to take pictures for which they will be remunerated will require written permission from the Renaissance Dog Association Show Committee and/or the official show photographer. This rule does also apply to any and all Specialty clubs holding their event in conjunction with an all breed club. Ringside candid photography of your dog is available upon request at any time during the day when the club's official show photographer is available.

Any tape used on the floors must be removed after the show with no residue remaining on the floor.

No catering of any kind is permitted.

Policy Changes: Chilliwack Heritage Park will not permit camping on Sunday after the show. Further, Washrooms will be locked at 10:00 pm until 7:00 am
